

From December 9, through 11, 2024, Staff reported to Atlanta Gas Light Company (Southern Company) Savannah service territory Savannah Georgia, to conduct an unannounced field inspection of the Operator's construction site. The location of the construction site was 930 Chatham Parkway Savannah, Georgia. Southeast Connections (SEC) Crew was installing a 2-inch plastic distribution pipeline and service to a new car wash. Staff conducted an inspection of construction materials/ components, construction description maps, and construction methods. Staff also conducted an OQ protocol 9 inspection on contract personnel.

NO VIOLATIONS FOUND

During this inspection The Georgia Public Service Commission Staff made an unannounced Construction Inspection on AGL (Southern Company) located at 930 Chatham Parkway Savannah, Georgia. Contractor was installing a 2-inch plastic pipeline and service to a new car wash at that location.

Commission Staff met with Jamie Coursey Construction Inspector for AGL. Mr. Cousey advised us that SEC was in the process of installing a 2-inch main and service to supply service to a new car wash. The bore was approximately 715-Feet with 92-Feet of service. Staff conducted inspection of construction materials, components, construction maps, and construction methods. Staff did not find any violations of the Pipeline Safety Regulations during this inspection.

During this inspection Staff observed as an AGLC contractor (Southeast Connections) crew perform OQ Protocol 9 field Task. Staff verified that the covered tasks were being performed in accordance with appropriate Operator-approved procedures, that the procedures were available at the job site, and that the individuals performing the observed covered tasks were adhering to the operator-approved procedures as written.

During the field evaluations, Staff observed Jose Zarate (Foreman) performing

- Task #OQ044AA Pipe Locating and Marking all conventional equipment / AGLC OPM Task performed correctly / qualification verified current until 05/30/2025;
- Task #0Q025 B- Installation of Plastic Pipe Including Boring / AGLC OPM Task performed correctly / qualification verified as current until 08/20/2027
- Task #OQ055A Visual Inspection of Joining material other than welding (heat fusion) / AGLC OPM Task performed correctly / qualification verified as current until 05/30/2025.

Staff verified that the individual was able to perform the covered tasks according to the procedure and was able to identify generic and task specific abnormal conditions and define the applicable actions.

As a result of this inspection Staff noted no probable violations of the minimum federal safety standards.

The issues may relate to the allegations, new information, proposed compliance order, proposed civil penalty, or any other recommendation for enforcement action. Please refer to Commission Rule 515-9-3-.11 and O.C.G.A. § 46-2-91 for assessment considerations upon which civil penalties are based. An operator's failure to specify an issue may result in a waiver of the right to raise that issue at hearing. The request must also indicate whether or not the Operator will be represented by counsel at the hearing.
