# CITY OF STATESBORO GAS DEPARTMENT / PUBLIC AWARENESS PROGRAM INSPECTION INSPECTION NUMBER JS24-038 / DOCKET NUMBER 37083

On December 4 & 5, 2024, Pipeline Safety Staff reported to the city of Statesboro Natural Gas System to perform a Public Awareness Program inspection.

During this inspection, the Operator was represented by: Joe Hollingsworth - Gas Superintendent Kelli Saxon - Utilities Administrative Assistant Steve Hotchkiss - Director of Public Utilities Chris Cawley - MGAG/SRCS (consultant)

Commission Staff was represented by: Jason Smith - Lead Inspector Glen Murphy - Pipeline Safety Inspector

At the time of this inspection the City of Statesboro Natural Gas System was under two (2) previously existing probable violations; however, because the Operator had not yet received the written report for these violations Staff did not perform a follow-up inspection.

During this inspection, Staff reviewed Statesboro Natural Gas System's Public Awareness Plan version 2.1 utilizing PHMSA Public Awareness Program Effectiveness Inspection form 21 to record the findings. Staff examined supporting records/documentation to verify compliance with the minimum safety standards.

### NOTICE OF PROBABLE VIOLATIONS

As a result of this inspection Staff found that the City of Statesboro Natural Gas System was in probable violation of the minimum federal safety standards; specifically:

- 1. 192.616 Public Awareness.
  - (c) The operator must follow the general program recommendations, including baseline and supplemental requirements of API RP 1162, unless the operator provides justification in its program or procedural manual as to why compliance with all or certain provisions of the recommended practice is not practicable and not necessary for safety.

PHMSA PAP Effectiveness inspection form question #10 states: Did the delivery of materials and messages meet or exceed the baseline delivery frequencies specified in API RP 1162, Table 2-1 through Table 2.3?

STAFFS COMMENTS: While reviewing records of Public Awareness Program materials / messages being delivered to the affected public, adjacent to unique attribute locations (the odorization station and/or regulator stations) the Operator informed Staff that they have five properties adjacent to their odorizer. During 2021, 2022 and 2023, Statesboro Gas Department's Superintendent personally delivered the PAP materials / messages to the five (5) adjacent properties. Staff asked for the days these deliveries were done, or any other sort of verification to prove hand delivery of the PAP materials / messages. The Operator informed Staff that in in 2021 it was done in mid-September. That was all the information the Operator was able to provide. They were not able to provide any documentation to prove the hand delivery of the PAP materials / messages in 2021 thru 2023.

# CITY OF STATESBORO GAS DEPARTMENT / PUBLIC AWARENESS PROGRAM INSPECTION INSPECTION NUMBER JS24-038 / DOCKET NUMBER 37083

PROBABLE VIOLATION: The City of Statesboro Gas Department failed to prove that they met or exceeded the baseline delivery frequencies of Public Awareness Program materials / messages for those adjacent to the pipeline odorization station, as specified in API RP 1162.

### 2. §192.616 - Public Awareness.

(g) The program must be conducted in English and in other languages commonly understood by a significant number and concentration of the non-English speaking population in the operator's area.

PHMSA PAP Effectiveness inspection form question #13 states: Were materials and messages developed and delivered in other languages commonly understood by a significant number and concentration of non-English speaking populations in the operator's areas?

STAFFS COMMENTS: The City of Statesboro Gas Department operates in Bulloch (home) county, Screven and Candler counties. The Operator's Public Awareness Plan states that when more than 5% of the citizens in their service area primary language spoken at home is a language other than English, the program will be conducted in the languages that are understood. While U.S. Census Bureau data show Statesboro & Screven County are under the 5%-mark, Candler County is more than 5%. It's at 9.7% Spanish being the language spoken at home. The Operator was not able to demonstrate Public Awareness materials and messages were being delivered in both English and Spanish (to the Candler County area of the system).

PROBABLE VIOLATION: The City of Statesboro Gas Department failed to conduct their Public Awareness Program in English and other languages commonly understood by a significant number and concentration of the non-English speaking population in their service area.

During this inspection Staff also performed an OQ Protocol 9 field evaluation inspection. Staff observed the Assistant Gas Superintendent, Nick Boggs performed task #0301-B (Manually Opening and Closing Service Valves) qualified through 10/08/2026; task #0681 (Joining Plastic Pipe Using Stab Fittings) qualified through 5/14/2025; and task #1291 (Locate Underground Pipelines) qualified through 6/06/2025.

His qualification records were provided for review prior to him performing the covered tasks. During the task evaluations Staff verified that the individual was able to perform each covered task by Statesboro's approved procedures, and he was able to identify the abnormal operating conditions associated with each task.
